Pam E. Webb grew up on the shores of the Indian River in Melbourne, Florida and since childhood has had a love for the sea. She and her late husband, Don, built their own 40' sail boat and sailed off on a 28-year adventure. During her years of cruising the Caribbean, Bahamas, and the Florida Keys, Pam discovered a natural talent for painting. Breath-taking turquoise waters, teeming with fascinating aquatic life and islands rich in history and covered with lush tropical foliage served as a natural inspiration for Pam to develop an artistic career. This cruising lifestyle is still revealed in her work. She is constantly challenged to capture the perfect transparency and magnificent colors of those underwater scenes. Pam has continued to expand her work to include other mediums. In recent years she continued her boating lifestyle, this time with her fiancée, David.

Pam's formal watercolor training included classes at Brevard Community College and Brevard Art Center and Museum in Melbourne, Florida. She received the Distinguished Alumna Award from Brevard Community College in 1990 for her watercolors of the Bahama Islands. Her work has also been shown at the Sail Fish Marina Art Shows in Singer Island, Florida, the Barrier Island Center, the Watercolors of Olde Brevard Art Show exhibit at Florida Institute of Technology, the King Center, the Kennedy Space Center, The Art Gallery of Viera, The Strawbridge Art Gallery, and the Environmental Learning Center in Vero Beach.

Pam was the illustrator for the book "Christopher Columbus," a biography written by Elaine Murray Stone. Pam also illustrated the book "Letters From Calvin, A Bahamian Potcake Dog" by Joe Kern which is available on Amazon.com. Pam designed a beautiful regatta T-shirt for the MARGARITAVILLE stores in Key West and New Orleans. She donated her popular painting "Dolphin Encounter" to the Dolphin Alliance Art Show to raise money to save the dolphins in the Indian River Lagoon. She is a member of the Brevard Watercolor Society, The National League of American Pen Women, and The Strawbridge Art League. Pam received an award from The Strawbridge Art League for her watercolor batik painting "Lion Fish". The National League of American Pen Women also awarded Pam an honorable mention for her painting "Marsh Landing". She received a Second Place Award for her painting "Jungle Sea Grapes" and Third Place for the "Florida Scrub-Jay" painting from the Indian River Bird and Nature Art Shows as the ELC in Vero Beach.

Pam specializes in watercolor portraits of cruising yachts, private homes, sailing boats, island scenes, lighthouses and underwater scenes. Reproductions of those original paintings are available in many sizes and are sold in galleries and gift shops all across Florida.
